
Events of the Month

In the United States, the Civil Aeronautics Authority is created to regulate air traffic. A Columbia University survey criticizes the American Legion as being fascist. President Roosevelt signs the \$3.75 billion Emergency Relief Appropriation Act. In Dublin, Douglas Hyde is inaugurated as the first Irish president under the new constitution. In other news, controversial psychoanalyst Sigmund Freud flees Austria and relocates in London. Alfredo Baldomir is inaugurated President of Uruguay. In Berlin, Adolf Hitler decides to confiscate "degenerate art."

The New York Yankees win the World Series in four games against Chicago. George Eyston sets the new auto speed record at 345 mph. California defeats Alabama 13-0 to win the Rose Bowl. Don Budge wins U.S. tennis title at Forest Hills to capture the Grand Slam. Floyd Roberts wins 26th Indy 500, averaging 117.2 mph. A horse named Lawrin, ridden by Eddie Arcaro wins the Kentucky Derby.
