Events of the Month

The three surviving Beatles -- Paul McCartney, Ringo Starr and George Harrison -- appear in public for the first time in nearly 30 years. They attend a June 8 memorial service in London for McCartney's wife, Linda. Swiss banks agree to pay \$600 million to Nazi Holocaust victims and their families. "The Cincinnati Enquirer" agrees to pay Chiquita Brands International \$10 million because of its series of stories accusing the fruit firm of illegal activities.

Real Quiet wins the Kentucky Derby and the University of Kentucky wins the NCAA basketball title, defeating Utah 78-69. The Chicago Bulls pick up their third straight NBA title. They beat the Utah Jazz four games to two. The Bulls' Michael Jordan is named MVP. The Detroit Redwings defeat the Washington Capitols to win hockey's Stanley Cup. Mark O'Meara wins the British Open title. France bests Brazil to capture soccer's World Cup.
