Western nations reject Soviet proposals for a vote on German reunification. In Washington, D.C., President Truman approves over \$3 billion for five different foreign aid bills. Richard G. Loaler performs the first human kidney transplant in Chicago. The Supreme Court prohibits the practice of segregation in two colleges. Commerce Department official William Remington resigns to defend himself against disloyalty accusations.
