

With Ron Howard as Richie and Shakespearean actor Henry Winkler as "The Fonz," the television series "Happy Days" rockets to the top of the fall television ratings. The America's Cup is successfully defended by the U.S. yacht, Courageous, which bests the challenger, Australia, in four straight races. The Nobel Prize is awarded to John Van Vleck of Harvard and Philip Anderson of Bell Labs (physics) Rosalyn Yalow, Roger Guillemin and Andrew Schally (medicine). The physics prize is for solid state electronics. The medical prize is for a study of the hypothalamus gland.

The New York Yankees beat the Los Angeles Dodgers four games to two to win baseball's World Series. It's the Oakland Raiders 32 and the Minnesota Vikings 14 in Super Bowl XI at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena. Portland defeats Philadelphia to become the National Basketball Association champion. A.J. Foyt wins Indy 500 for the fourth time. The New York Cosmos win the American Soccer League title. Montreal beats Boston to capture hockey's Stanley Cup. A horse named Seattle Slew wins the Kentucky Derby.
